## NJ SETS ALL-TIME POINT RECORD; RIOT! LOSES 1st HOME GAME EVER!

### NJ Kings 97, PA Wildcats 41

The New Jersey Kings set the league's all-time point record with a sizzling 97-41 trouncing of the PA Wildcats. New Jersey WR Jerry Rice tied the all-time individual performance for a wide receiver with a 4 TD, 172 yard performance. Rice was just 8 yards short of a 38-point performance, which would have set an all-time record for any individual player.

Let's not forget, either, that Kings QB Steve Young also set the season-to-date record for an individual performance by a QB, with 24 points. All four of Young's TDs on the day went to Rice.

Kings RBs, going into the game with a league-low 24 cumulative points on the season, virtually doubled their entire output for the year as Johnny Johnson chipped in 17 and Robert Delpino contributed 6. The Kings, coming into the week with the lowest point total in the league, jumped to 7th in that category.

Wildcat RB Gary Brown ran for 166 yards and a TD in a losing effort.

### SC Bandits 52, LA Riot! 27

Defending FFL Champion SC Bandits handed the LA Riot! the team's first home loss in the franchise's history. The loss by the Riot! also ends the league's longest winning streak in history at 10 games as well as handing the Riot! their first loss of this year.

Bandits QB Warren Moon tossed 4 TD passes as the defending champs strengthened their grip on the Central Division title.

Riot! injury woes continue to mount as RB Barry Foster and WR Andre Reed suffered serious injuries.

# Week 11 Game Summaries

## RD Raptors 82, VA Big Bang 25

Seven of the eight Rattlin' Raptors scored and recently-acquired RB Ron Moore was the only player (other than the kicker) who didn't score a touchdown as the Raptors rolled to the second-highest point total of the year. The Raptors are putting on a big push and up their record to 7-4 as they remain only a game behind Miami as the Southern Division race heads into the final stretch. The key game could be Miami at Richmond in the final week of the regular season.

The Big Virginia Bang, meanwhile, has decided to lay down and play dead rather than try to be a spoiler. The Big Bang started a 3rd string QB and 2 RBs who are hurt and were inactive for this week's games. The commissioner is considering possible rule changes to prevent this kind of gutlessness in future years.

## NY Griffons 18, BR Blowfish 14

What a yawner! Griffon TE Jacke Harris was the only positional player (RB, WR or TE) on EITHER team to score a TD in this game. The Griffons, who seem to bring out the absolute worst in the opposition, closes to within 2 games of the Coastal Division lead. Griffons management is confident the team now has a shot at the division title, rather than just securing the Wild Card spot for the playoffs.

The Blowfish, meanwhile, have fallen 3 games off the lead in the Central Division. They face a formidable challenge considering their 0-3 record within the division.

## MI Muffdivers 35, DS Armadillos 16

The Muffdivers maintain their one game lead in the Southern Division and improved their roster for the stretch run with this weeks trade acquiring WR Webster Slaughter from the Armadillos. Muffdiver TE Eric Green is proving to be a big contributor to the Muffdiver attack which leads the league in points from running backs. Miami has two more home games (against Pittsburgh and Dallas) before heading to Virginia and then to the showdown at Richmond in Week 15.

The Armadillos, judging from the recent housecleaning, are concentrating on next year, now having acquired six draft picks in the first 3 rounds of the 1994 draft.

## PN Penetrators 29, PG Pachyderms 14

RB Marcus Allen provided the only points for the Pachyderms while Penetrator WR Reggie Langhorne turned in yet another 100+ yard game as the Penetrators hang on to their slim hopes for a Wild Card berth.

Pachyderm WRs Gary Clark and Michael Jackson, who cost the team three draft picks this past week, contributed a combined 3 catches for 72 yards.

Penetrator WR Willie Davis, who was forced to sit out last week after a lineup snafu ruled him ineligible, responded this week with a 66 yard touchdown reception en route to a 115 yard receiving performance.

The Penetrators up their record to 5-6 while the Pachyderms drop to 4-7, despite an undefeated record in divisional play.

☞ Next week, Week 13, has two games on Thanksgiving Day. **DON'T FORGET** to call in your lineup before you stuff yourself with turkey and fall asleep on the couch!

- The Big Virginia Bang Fire Sale continues! The Big Bang (and we here at FFF use the term "big" rather loosely), trades RB Ron Moore, Tarots, to the Richmond Rattlin' Raptors for a 3rd round 1994 draft pick.

- Virginia then adds 3rd string QB Billy Joe Hobert, Redders, to fill the empty roster spot.

- Richmond drops RB Roger Craig, Norsemen, to make room for Moore on their roster.

☞ And did we mention, Dallas had a fire sale too:

- Dallas trades RB Keith Byars, RB, Da Fish, and an 8th round draft pick to the New Jersey Kings for Girl Scout RB Leroy Hoard and a 3rd round draft pick.

- Dallas trades WR Webster Slaughter, Derricks, and a 9th round draft pick to Miami for RB Brian Mitchell, Foreskins, and a 1st round draft pick.

- Dallas trades WR Michael Jackson, Girl Scouts and a 6th round draft pick to the Pittsburgh Pachyderms for RB Mark Higgs, Da Fish, and a 2nd round draft pick.

☞ In case you hadn't noticed, Dallas has now accumulated for itself **two** 1st round picks, **two** 2nd round picks, and **two** 3rd round picks.

- Pennsylvania Pussycats trade WR Gary Clark, Tarots, to the Pittsburgh Pachyderms for a 5th round and an 8th round pick.

- Pittsburgh drops WR Mark Clayton, Da Pack, to free up the roster spot (this is, by the way, the second time PG has dropped Clayton this season).

- PA adds Jeff Graham, WR, Stillers. Graham becomes the 4th player this year to have been drafted, dropped, and re-added by the same team.

- PA also made 2 other drop/adds: dropping QB Rodney Peete, Lions, and Dwight Stone, WR, Stillers. PA adds RB Gary Brown (We are ... Penn State), Derricks, and QB John Friesz, Lightning Bolts.

**DID YOU KNOW:** New York and Penna. have kept only 3 players from this year's draft on their roster continuously. Wow.
