RIOT!, BANDITS CLINCH THEIR DIVISIONS!

Last year's top two money winners, defending champion State College Bandits and point champion L.A. Riot! became the first two teams to wrap up playoff berths as they clinched their respective divisions in Week 13.

In a week where the four teams with the worst records managed to pull out wins, the Bandits and the Riot! were the only teams with winning records to post victories.

With 2 weeks left in the season, no team has yet been eliminated from the Consolation bracket.

The Bandits trailed Butler going into the Monday night game, but mounted a late charge to sink the Blowfish by 10. Los Angeles missed the deadline and had to play their previous week's line-up, but still managed a 6 pt. win over NY.

Miami's woes continued with a 2 point loss to Dallas. Richmond lost by 3 points at Virginia, a game which would have ended in a tie without the home field advantage. Miami and Richmond remain tied in the South.

The 2nd place team in the Southern will fight it out with NY for the Wild Card spot, but NY would lose a tiebreaker to either team. New York can guarantee itself the Wild Card spot with 2 wins to close the season.

Week 13 Game Summaries

SC Bandits 34, BR Blowfish 24

Running back Marion Butts came up big for the Bandits Monday night, rushing for a TD and over 80 yards in helping the Bandits overcome a 3 point deficit to beat the Blowfish. The defending champions have captured their first Central Division title. QB Warren Moon, behind the resurging Oilers, also chipped in a good day for the Bandits.

The Blowfish, despite having 6 of 8 starters score, were denied a second consecutive division crown. The Blowfish left a lot of points on the bench this week that could have made a difference, including 100+ yard rusher Robert Smith and TD scorers Ed McCaffrey and Ricky Proehl.

NJ Kings 61, PN Penetrators 19

The Kings appear to be hitting their stride after having thrown in the towel and trading Jerry Rice. For the third consecutive week, the Kings were the top offensive team in the league and have now climbed to 5th place in the overall point race.

Kings QB Steve Young eclipsed his own previous record in setting an all-time league high performance for a quarterback. Young's 4 TD, 462 yard passing performance garnered 32 points for the Kings and shattered the old QB high of 27 points, also held by Young from week 2 in 1992.

Pennington's hopes for a Wild Card slot were roadkill in the path of the resurrected Kings juggernaut.

PA Wildcats 19, PG Pachyderms 13

The Wildcats, losers of a lot of lopsided contests this year, finally pull out an ugly win over the only Central Division team the Wildcats had never previously beaten.

The Cats left a lot of points on the bench, but another double-digit performance from former Penn State star and Houston back-up RB Gary Brown provided the margin of victory.

The Pachyderms' only bright spot was RB Marcus Allen, who appears to be the surprise of the year. Allen's 71 points on the year have easily surpassed all expectations in his sure-bet campaign as the Comeback Player of the Year in the NFL.

LA Riot! 38, NY Griffons 32

A line-up snafu by LA owner Sam McClain failed to make a significant difference as the Riot! captures it's second consecutive Coastal Division crown. McClain's line-up was 1/2 hour late and ruled ineligible by the commissioner. But LA's intended lineup would only have made a difference of 2 points on the week. The Riot! has still never lost a Coastal Division game. The Riot! may be a little concerned at WR, however. Riot! receivers have only managed to post 4 points on the board in the last 3 weeks.

The Griffons control their own destiny for the Wild Card spot. Wins in the last two weeks would assure them the Wild Card, but NY has to travel to the red hot NJ Kings this wk.

VA Big Bang 40, RD Raptors 37

Despite still playing a 3rd string QB and a RB on IR, the Big Bang manages to beat the Raptors to keep the Southern Division race in a dead heat. Nate Lewis' TD for the Chargers Monday night put the Big Bang over the top. Virginia would have tied the Rattlin' Raptors had it not been for the home field advantage. Virginia is still tied with the PA Wildcats for the worst record and a shot at the number one draft pick for 1994.

Raptors QB John Elway proved he is human after all, with a 5 point performance on the week. Richmond has now dropped from the cumulative season stat lead from the QB position. The New Jersey Kings have now wrested that title for the time being.

DS Armadillos 33, MI Muffdivers 31

Recent trade acquisition WR Courtney Hawkins paced the Armadillos with 11 points as the Dillos win their 5th game of the year despite a negative point performance from QB Jim Kelly. Dallas has now played itself into a position to possibly capture a spot in the Consolation bracket.

More bad news for the Muffdivers this week was the loss of Barry Sanders to a knee injury. The Muffdivers managed to play the closest game of the week, and only ONE more rushing yard for RB Natrone Means on Mon. night would have added another 3 points and pushed the Muffdivers over the top.

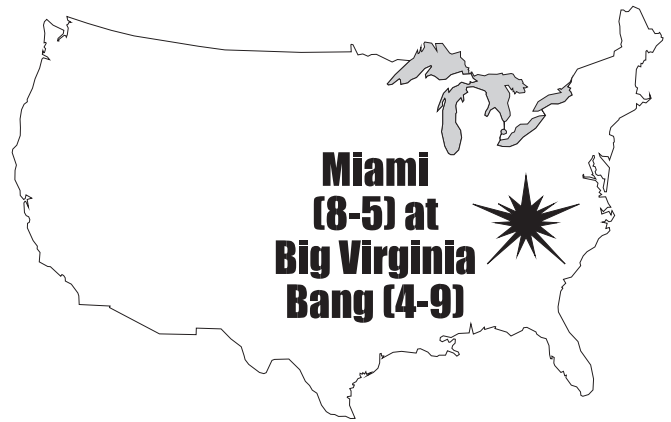
