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SABOTAGE!

Armadillos investigated for possible roll in 2 recent Cowboy auto accidents

Informed sources have told Fantasy Football Flyer that at least two of the automobile accidents that have beset Dallas Cowboy players have come under suspicion. The office of the Dallas Armadillos is reportedly a target of investigators, who are trying to determine if the accidents were a plot to sabotage key players on rival FFL teams.

Cheesehead RB Emmitt Smith's recent fender-bender was the first "accident" to come under investigation. The accident was reportedly "just down the street" from the Armadillo offices. Dallas owner Paul Gilgallon confirmed to FFF that the accident site was very close to his residence, but would neither confirm nor deny if he played any part in the accident.

Wildcats WR Alvin Harper was the victim of a second suspicious accident. Harper had borrowed teammate Michael Irvin's car and was involved in an accident which was also reportedly near the Armadillo offices.

Both Smith and Harper were

uninjured in the accidents.

Fantasy Football Flyer has learned, however, through informed sources, that Gilgallon's fiancée, Jackie Ross, may be questioned concerning incidents surrounding the Harper accident.

Witnesses reportedly overheard Ross saying that Harper had used her phone to call police, and that she had made an attempt to "distract" him from reporting the accident. Speculation is rampant that Ross's actions were aimed at delaying Harper from returning to the accident site long enough to be charged with leaving the scene.

Sources also told FFF that Ross's attempt to distract Harper were of an extremely sexual nature.

Harper, however, had returned to the accident site by the time police had arrived, so the attempted sexual distraction by Ross was apparently averted.

A 1st round draft pick by the Wildcats, Harper is reportedly "very close" to Wildcat owner Ron Yeany.

Wildcats clinch Central; Other division races tighten

The Pennsylvania Wildcats became the first FFL team to clinch their division with a 60-31 win this week over Miami. The Muffdiver loss allowed Wisconsin to pull back into a tie with Miami atop the Far-Flung Division. And Virginia's loss has allowed both Mercer and New York to close to within one game in the Eastern Division.

Wisconsin 67, Virginia 38

Emmitt Smith scored 17 and Steve Young added 16 to pace the Cheeseheads, who coupled with

Miami's loss, have now pulled into a tie atop the Far Flung Division. Young and Smith remain #1 and #2 in FFL scoring. Terry Allen added 11, as 7 of 8 Cheeseheads scored. Chris Warren lead the Big Bang with 16.

New York 62, Butler 27

Carl Pickens, picked up off waivers just this week, scored a whopping 32 for the Griffons, as they pull within one game of the Eastern Division lead. Picken's score was the 2nd-best performance by a WR this year.



With the Wildcats clinching the first playoff berth, at least one of these teams won't make the playoffs. And don't forget about 7-4 Mercer, who this week is favored over the team with the league's worst record, State College.



Week 11 Game Summaries, con't

All 8 Griffons starters scored, with Randall Cunningham's -1 the lone scorer in negative points. Cunningham slips to the #4 scoring QB in the FFL. Gary Brown lead New York RBs with 8 points, while Herman Moore led the receivers with 6. The Griffons continue to battle Dallas for the league low in kicking points, as Jason Hanson managed only 2. Butler's Leonard Russell lead the Blowfish with 14 points, and kicker Morten Anderson added 9. QB Rick Mirer scored a big fat goose egg for the third consecutive week, and even more amazing, WR Sterling Sharpe has scored 0 for four consecutive weeks.

Pennsylvania 60, Miami 31

Wildcat RB Barry Sanders came back to haunt his old team as Sanders burned the Muffdivers with 23 points, racking up the 6th highest rushing total in NFL history with 237 yards. The Wildcats had no touchdowns from the RBs or the WRs, and WR Brian Blades failed to score for the first time in 1994. Jim Everett added 10 points, and kicker Jeff Jaeger added 9. Alvin Harper, listed as doubtful on NFL injury reports, started for the Wildcats and chipped in 8. The Muffdivers were lead by WRs Rob Moore and Webster Slaughter, who each scored 8. The usually-reliable running back duo of Jerome Bettis and Natrone Means were a disappointment for Miami. Bettis was shut out, and Means scored only 2.

Mercer 50, Dallas 28

Mercer's Norm Johnson came one point shy of tying the all-time FFL record for a kicker. Johnson's 21 points set the FFL single high performance for a kicker this year. Jeff George

added 11 points for the Mustangs, and WR Andre Reed chipped in 8. Mercer snaps a 2-game losing streak and pulls to within one game of the lead in the Eastern Division. Dallas receivers continue to lead the FFL in scoring at the position. Jerry Rice added 11 this week, while Brent Jones added 6. Dallas is rumored to have started Jim Kelly for the last time this year, and may not protect either Kelly or Montana at the end of 1994.

Los Angeles 34, Pittsburgh 32

A missed field goal in the Monday Night game by Pachyderm kicker Steve Christie broke up another potential tie, as the Riot! snatches the victory and pulls to within one game of the lead in the Far Flung Division. The defending champions were paced by WR Flipper Anderson, who posted his second consecutive 11 point week. Dan Marino added 8 and Haywood Jeffries added 6. The Riot! was also pleased to see RB Barry Foster getting a few carries this week, as LA prepares to make a late charge. Pittsburgh RB Lorenzo White lead the team with 11 points on the weekend, and QB Brett Favre added 8. Favre is tied with Jim Everett as the 2nd highest scoring QB in the FFL, behind Steve Young.

Richmond 20, State College 5

State College wins the inside track to the #1 draft pick, with a 20-5 loss to the Raptors. The Bandits managed only 2 points from TE Adrian Cooper and 3 from K Doug Brien. Richmond, also trying to conserve for next year, posted 5 goose eggs, but Gary Anderson scored 11, John Elway scored 4, the home field advantage added 3, and Jay Novacek scored 2.

GUEST EDITORIAL

Virginia

November 8, 1994, was a dark day in the history of the Big Virginia Bang. The Big Bang ownership was a solid supporter and massive contributor to the campaign of the Great American Patriot Ollie North. Unfortunately, the philandering, Clinton-loving, Chuck "all she gave me was a back rub" Robb somehow beat North in the election. Since Virginia will not have a "normal", red-blooded, God-fearing, America-first Senator, the Big Bang ownership believes that its team can no longer represent Virginia in good conscience. First, the Southern Division rises again. The reborn division will include the Big Carolina Bang, Richmond Rattlin' Raptors, Dallas Armadillos and Pittsburgh Pachyderms. Carolina, Richmond and Dallas are in because they are the only FFL sites where a Southern accent can be heard. The lack of the Southern accent in Miami (populated mainly by Latinos) excludes the Muffdivers (pronounced "Moofdivers" down there) from the Southern Division. Pittsburgh is in because the FFL has a moral obligation to keep brothers together. (Note: the aforementioned division realignment has nothing to do with the Big Bang's 10-2 record versus Richmond, Dallas and Pittsburgh). Second, with respect to the remaining squads, who cares? If the Commissioner refuses to put this proposal to a vote, then this should be clear to everyone and all the owners should demand that a change be made.

By the way, much ado has been made in this publication about an alleged attempted coup in the Commissioner's office.
