State College's losing streak ends at 9: Virginia clinches tie in Eastern Division

The State College Bandits, 1992 FFL Champions, proved they have a little more life left in 1994 by snapping a losing streak that fell one short of tying the all-time FFL record of 10 consecutive losses set by Dallas in 1992. The Bandits, who benched most of the starting lineup last week, ran out all their stars for a 66-60 win over the Mercer Mustangs.

The Big Virginia/Carolina/Whatever Bang clinched at least a tie for the Eastern Division with a win over the Miami Muffdivers, coupled with losses by Mercer and New York.

New York was this week's roadkill victim by the Wisconsin Cheeseheads, who take a full one-game lead over the Muffdivers in the Far-Flung Division.

Wisconsin 78, New York 28

Wisconsin had all 8 starters score -in double digits -- in winning their 5th consecutive game. Steve Young and Emmitt Smith are fast distancing themselves from the rest of the pack as the two most prolific FFL scorers this season. Young posted 24 on the weekend, while Smith added 17. Rookie RB Erict Rhett added 10, Irving Fryar posted 8, and both Keith Jackson and Pete Stoyanovich added 6. The Griffons were paced by Thurman Thomas, who posted 11 points and Herman Moore, who added 6.

State College 66. Mercer 60

Seven of 8 starters scored for the Bandits, as they post their second-best effort of the season. Four starters scored in double digits, led by Warren Moon with 18. Wide receivers Anthony Miller and Courtney Hawkins added 13 and 12, respectively, and RB Marion Butts contributed 11. Bandits fans are exhuberant over having beaten a potential playoff team whose owner reportedly was expecting SC to toss in the towel this week. Mercer had 2 huge performances from Andre Reed, who scored 26, and Jeff George, who scored 21. The rest of the lineup, however, managed only 10 points.

Butler 55, Los Angeles 31

The Blowfish keep their slim hopes for a wildcard berth alive with the win over the Riot!, whose playoff hopes are also dimming fast. Tim Brown paced the Blowfish with 20, and the trio of Brett Perriman, Jake Reed and Johnny Mitchell added 8 points apiece. The Blowfish, apparently having lost faith in WR Sterling Sharpe, benched him for the first time this year, passing up what would have been his best performance on the year - a potential 17 points. The Riot! were boosted by the return of RB Barry Foster, who led the team with 11 points, but 3 wide receivers, including 2 just added to the roster this week, all took goose eggs on the weekend.

Virginia 50, Miami 34

Quick - who is the 3rd leading point scorer in the FFL behind Smith and Young? All those who answered RB Chris Warren get to write additional guest editorials at the end of the season. Warren's 14 points this week for the Big Bang was eclipsed, however, by WR Terrance Mathis, who scored 23. The other 6 players on the VA roster managed only 10 points on the weekend. Miami was paced by RB Lewis Tillman, who scored 17. The big RB punch of Jerome Bettis and Natrone Means was stifled for the second consecutive week, managing only 2 points for Means.

Pennsylvania 44. Richmond 11

Six of 8 starters for the Wildcats scored, led by QB Jim Everett's 12. RB Rodney Hampton added 8 and Marshall Faulk added 6, but the NFL's **CONTINUED INSIDE**
