PA Wildcat fans and players protest the new team logo

A cat is making a big stink in Central Pennsylvania, and this odor isn't coming from the litter box.

Fans and players of the PA Wildcats have expressed a strong dislike for the new team logo, a ferocious cat breaking through a silhouette of the state.

The new logo was unveiled in pregame ceremonies before the Wildcats' home opening win over the Wisconsin Cheeseheads in FFL Week 2.

Wildcats kicker, Jeff Jaeger, has threatened to file a suit against the team to pay for therapy for his 5-year-old son. Jaeger claims his young son was traumatized by the image of the animal the first time he wore a team jacket home from a recent practice.

Jaeger also said he will seek compensation for his family's

necessity to call the fire department to get the family cat, Snookums, down from a maple tree the day after he wore the uniform home.

Fans are also protesting the logo, with many fans seeking season ticket refunds because their children refuse to go to the football games for fear they encounter the ferocious logo.

A spokesman for the team who asked not to be identified said the team will unveil a new, friendlier logo at their next home game, in FFL Week 5.

The team, which this week is playing on the road in Los Angeles for the third consecutive year, won't have to worry about the uniforms and logos this week since the Wildcats-Riot! game will feature "Turn Back The Clock" uniforms from 1992.

Week 3 Game Summaries

Wisconsin 90. Dallas 45

Dallas tied their team's highest score (most ever without home field advantage) but was just roadkill for the mighty Cheeseheads, who jumped into the overall point lead. Wisconsin fans are saying "Who needs Jerry Rice" after Terry Allen finally produced for the team, scoring 26 on the weekend. Allen's big weekend was eclipsed by Steve Young who scored 31, coming within one point of tying his all-time FFL record. Big weeks for Joe Montana and Jerry Rice were lost in the Dallas effort. All 8 starters scored for the Cheezers.

New York 65. State College 38

The Griffons' waiver-wire pickup of Dave Meggett paid off handsomely this weekend, as Meggett became the first FFL player to ever score in 4 different categories in one week. Meggett had points for rushing TDs, a passing TD, rushing yardage and receiving yardage. His point total for the weekend was 23. Superstar WRs John Taylor and Herman Moore each contributed 11 points for NY. State College RB Marion Butts and WR Andre Rison led the scoring for the Bandits.

Miami 58, Los Angeles 44

The defending champions drop their home opener, and drop to 0-3 overall, after being pounded by Miami, which saw 7 of its 8 starters score. The Miami charge was led by WR Michael Timpson and RB Jerome Bettis, who scored 14 each, and RB Natrone Means, who added 11. LA RB Barry Foster's 23 points was the bright spot for the Riot!

Butler 52. Richmond 26

WR Tim Brown's 14 points and Leonard Russell's 12 led a Blowfish attack that overwhelmed a punchless Raptors squad. Butler wins it's first game at home after two road losses, including a loss by home field advantage. Richmond RB Emmitt Smith's 17 point Monday night performance was the sole highlight for the Raptors.

Pennsylvania 49. Virginia 46

Barry Sanders set a personal and Detroit team record for number of carries in helping the Wildcats remain the only undefeated team in the league. Wildcat fans were on the edge of their seats all Monday night, as Sanders and WR Alvin Harper managed to overcome QB Scott Mitchell and a 12-point deficit going into the Monday night game. Seven of eight starters scored for both teams. Sanders' 194 yard performance led the Wildcat scorers, while Terry Kirby's 14 points led the Bang.


