A highly-placed FFL source has told Fantasy Football Flyer that LA Riot! owner Sam McClain has fired the team coach.

Although details are sketchy at presstime (on THIS story, that is), there apparently is a "smoking gun list" of items the owner has compiled in reaching the decision to fire the coach of the defending FFL champions.

Mr. McClain did not return repeated calls the Fantasy Football Flyer staff made to both his office and his residence.

FFL Commissioner Nick Fisher. who is in California on non-league business, saw McClain on Sunday

and confirmed that McClain does indeed have a "bulleted list," but Fisher would not comment on the contents of the list.

The Riot! this past weekend lost for the fourth consecutive week, a crushing 80-27 loss at the hands of the PA Wildcats, who had lost to the Riot! in both previous meetings between the two teams. The Riot! is the only winless team in the league.

The Riot! this year has been plagued by coaching gaffes, including more this past week: Dan Marino (25), Flipper Anderson (11) and Edgar Bennett (6) accounted for 42 potential points that were left sitting on the LA bench.

MORE CONTROVERSY IN VIRGINIA: The Big Virginia Bang which last week asked for an "independent" inquiry into allegations that the NY Griffons orchestrated an "attack" on one of his players in a bar brawl — is this week reportedly alleging that the Griffons purposely ordered their placekicker, Jason Hanson, to miss a potential gamewinning field goal in order to prolong the game, allowing Barry Sanders to surpass 175 yards rushing and thus provide the PA Wildcats with their margin of victory in a 49-46 win over the Big Bang.

The Big Bang was also slapped with a double-dose of bad news this

weekend; potential ending injuries to both RB Terry Kirby and WR Mike Pritchard. No news yet as to whether Virginia is alleging any NY Griffon involvement in the injuries to Kirby or Pritchard.

RICHMOND **PLAYERS** MISS TEAM BUS: Eleven Rattlin' Raptors missed the team bus this weekend, leaving only 5 players to start for the team. The Raptors had to play without any running backs, but did manage to start a quarterback, three wide receivers and a kicker.

Fans were baffled as to how such a mishap could take place, considering that it was a home game.

Pennsylvania 80. Los Angeles 27

The third time's the charm for the Wildcats, who manage their first win against the Riot! in three consecutive tries on the road. All 8 starters scored for the Wildcats, albeit QB Stan Humphries' contribution was a -2. The team set a league season record for points from 3 running backs (48), which were led by Barry Sanders' 24 and Gary Brown's 17. The Riot! managed only one TD, a Drew Bledsoe to Ben Coates pass which garnered more points for the 'Cats than it did for the Riot!

Wisconsin 61. Butler 49

Johnny Johnson (17), Terry Allen (14) and former Blowfish Irving Fryar (13) all scored in double digits for the Cheeseheads as they retain the overall point lead by a slim margin over Pennsylvania. Steve Young and Keith Jackson added 8 apiece for Wisconsin. The Blowfish had 7 of 8 starters score, but in a losing effort. Eric Metcalf's 14 points led the way for the Blowfish. Butler's 4 receivers, however, managed only 13 points amongst them.

Dallas 54, State College 52

In a real tight game, Dallas scored an alltime team high, led by Cris Carter's 23, Jerry Rice's 14 and Rosie Potts's 11. Joe Montana, however, managed to tie the season low for an individual QB performance (-3). For State College, the balance hung in Monday night's performance by Anthony Miller, whose 6 points left the Bandits 2 points short.

Virginia 46, New York 44

Home field advantage and a Monday night injury to Thurman Thomas allowed the Big Bang to snatch a victory from the jaws of defeat. Thomas' 20 point performance was tallied in slightly over 2 quarters of play, as he sat out most of the second half with an injury. The Griffons' Jeff Hosteller also chipped in 12 points for NY. Virginia's Chris Warren continues as the FFL pacesetter, adding another 17 points this week...

Miami 41, Pittsburgh 33

Muffdiver sophomore RBs Jerome Bettis and Natrone Means contributed 11 and 8 point performances, respectively, for Miami, and kicker John Carney's 14 points led the squad. Miami wins despite getting only 2 points from 4 starting receivers. Over half the total Pachyderm score came from QB Brett Favre. Four Pittsburgh receivers took the collar for the weekend. Kicker Steve Christie continues to be solid, adding another 9 points.

Mercer 38. Richmond 18

Jeff George propelled the Mustangs to the win over the hapless Rattlin' Raptors, who could only start 5 players. George's 12 led Mercer, and K Norm Johnson added 9, with RB Keith Byars chipping in 8. Richmond did not start any running backs, and the three receivers that started - David Palmer, David Mims and Tim McGee, all posted goose-eggs. Only John Elway, Gary Anderson and home field advantage prevented the shutout.
