GAME SUMMARIES:

LOS ANGELES 75, PITTSBURGH 62

The Riot! is on a hot streak and once again Pittsburgh posts some impressive points and still manages to lose. 7 of 8 starters scored for LA, which was led by WR Cris Carter's 23 points. QB Drew Bledsoe and RBs Edgar Bennett and Ricky Watters all scored in double digits. The Pachyderms were paced by QB Brett Favre, whose 28 points set the season high for all QBs and fell just 4 points shy of the all-time FFL record.

STATE COLLEGE 68, RICHMOND 60

QB Warren Moon paced the Bandits with 24 points. RBs Harvey Williams and Derek Loville each scored in double figures. Richmond was paced by WR Bill Brooks with 17 points and RB Rashaan Salaam with 14 points.

PENNSYLVANIA 67, CAROLINA 64

The home field advantage has prevented another tie, as the league still bucks the odds and avoids our first-ever tie. PA wins by virtue of home field for the first time in team history. The Wildcats were paced by WR Robert Brooks, who scored 20 points. QB Erik Kramer added 15 and RBs Barry Sanders and Marshall Faulk added 11 each. Carolina was paced by WR Curtis Conway, who scored 20. QB Scott Mitchell added 15 and WR Vincent Brisby added 14.

NEW YORK 52, WISCONSIN 40

All 8 Griffons scored, as the team with the league's best record has tied the best-ever start and set this year's longest winning streak at 7 games. The receivers paced NY's effort, as Carl Pickens led the team with 17 and Isaac Bruce added 14. Wisconsin was paced by RBs Emmitt Smith, who scored 16 and Errict Rhett, who scored 11.

DALLAS 51, MERCER 31

Three Armadillos scored in double figures, paced by WR Jerry Rice, who scored 17. QB Dan Marino added 14 and RB Bernie Parmalee added 11. Seven of 8 Mustangs scored, but none of them scored in double digits. Mercer was paced by kicker Norm Johnson's 7 points.

BUTLER 46, MIAMI 30

The Blowfish running backs, for the first time in recent memory, outscored the Butler receivers. Craig Heyward led the team, with 14 points. QB Jeff Blake added 9, and RB Vaugn Dunbar added 8, as did WR Brett Perriman. The Miami effort was paced by Jerome Bettis, who finally woke up and scored in double digits (11) for the first time this season. WR Rob Moore added 10 points.
