For Dallas, Dan Marino's Dallas debut was successful, with 15 points. RB Bernie Parmalee added 14, and Jerry Rice pitched in 11. Kicker John Carney, coming off a record-setting 1994, started the year on a down note with (-1).

MERCER MUSTANGS 55, BUTLER BLOWFISH 38

What's this? The Mercer Mustangs with the second-highest point total on the weekend? Has the addition of a co-manager helped that much in Mercer? The Mustangs had 4 starters score in double digits, led by QB Jeff George, who posted 12. RB Terry Allen, WR Bert Emanuel and K Norm Johnson all added 11 points. Butler's highlight was posted by K Morten Anderson, who chipped in 12 points. WR Eric Metcalf added 7, and QB Jeff Blake and WR Tim Brown each added 6 in the losing effort.

BIG CAROLINA BANG 54, STATE COLLEGE BANDITS 11

Carolina has started the season with a big bang, handing State College one of their worst defeats in team history. WR Michael Haynes paced the Bang, with 11 points, while K Pete Stoyanovich added 10. QB Trent Dilfer added 9 and RB Bam Morris chipped in 8 points. State College scored only 5 points from QB Warren Moon and 2 each from RB Derek Loville and K Matt Stover. You have to expect this was a real anomaly, however. SC won't experience too many weeks when Terry Kirby, Harvey Williams, Anthony Miller and Andre Rison are all shut out on the weekend!

NEW YORK GRIFFONS 45, PITTSBURGH PACHYDERMS 25

QB Randal Cunningham (-1) and RB Thurman Thomas (0) may not be the Griffon mainstays this year, but New York has reloaded in other areas. The Griffons were led by WR Herman Moore's 14 points, while RB Gary Brown added 8 as did newcomers RB Terrell Davis and WR Isaac Bruce. Pittsburgh QB Brett Favre was the high point for the Pachyderms, as he added 10 points. WR Haywood Jeffries managed a TD, but 3 PG running backs were all shut out.

RICHMOND RATTLIN' RAPTORS 38, PENNSYLVANIA WILDCATS 31

The off-season acquisition of WR Michael Irvin paid off handsomely for the Raptors, who were propelled to the win over the Wildcats by Irvin's 11 point performance in the Monday night game. QB John Elway added 7, while K Gary Anderson and rookie RB Rashaan Salaam added 6 apiece. QB Jim Everett's 12 points were the highlight for the Wildcats. Barry Sanders added 8 and TE Ben Coates pitched in 5. Two PA wide receivers drafted in the 1st and 2nd rounds combined for a measly 4 points between the two.

LOS ANGELES RIOT 34, MIAMI MUFFDIVERS 20

Kicker Jason Elam almost single-footedly propelled the Riot to a Week One win. Elam's 16 points was the week's high point total for a kicker. QB Drew Bledsoe added 8 and WR Cris Carter pitched in 5. Three LA running backs (Ricky Watters, Edgar Bennett and rookie James Stewart) were shut out on the weekend. Miami's high scorer was QB Troy Aikman, who managed just 6 points. WRs Brian Blades and Jeff Graham scored 5 points apiece.
