GAME SUMMARIES:

NEW YORK 81, DALLAS 38

Griffon receivers continue their absolute dominance of all opponents. WR Isaac Bruce led all Fantasy players this week, scoring 26 points. WRs Herman Moore and Joey Galloway added 12 and 11 points apiece. QB Jim Kelly chipped in 17 and K Fuad Reveiz contributed 10. The Griffon running game remained a tad suspect, however, as 3 running backs posted only 2 total points. The Dillos were led by QB Chris Miller, who had 15 points, and RB Dave Meggett and WR Henry Ellard, who each added 8.

CAROLINA 78, MIAMI 21

Four Big Bang starters scored in double digits, as all but one player scored for Carolina. The Big Bang was led by WR Curtis Conway's 20 points. RB Chris Warren added 14, QB Scott Mitchell had 13 and WR Michael Haynes added 12. Miami's feeble effort was led by Eric Green's 6-point contribution. K Chip Lohmiller set the season-to-date low for a kicker with negative 2.

STATE COLLEGE 61, PITTSBURGH 31

The Bandits have won 2 in a row, and yes, there has been an Anthony Miller siting for the second straight week. The high priced '94 free agent scored 23 points as 7 of 8 starters scored for State College. QB Warren Moon added 10 points and RB Derek Loville and WR Willie Davis added 8 points each. Pittsburgh's only highlight of the year remains QB Brett Favre, who led the team again with 16 points.

LOS ANGELES 53, RICHMOND 44

Only 4 Riot! starters scored positive points, but those 4 big weeks paid off for Los Angeles. RB Ricky Watters led the team with 14 points, RB Edgar Bennett added 13 as did kicker Jason Elam. RB James Stewart added 11. QB Jeff Hostetler was the only other Riot! player to score, and he took 1 point off the overall total. The Raptors were led by QB John Elway, who scored 17 points, and RB Garrison Hearst, who added 11.

PENNSYLVANIA 39, BUTLER 19

Backup PA quarterback Erik Kramer led the Wildcats with 14 points, and RB Barry Sanders and WR Robert Brooks each added 8 points for PA. WR Tony Martin, a starter every week so far, failed to score for the first time this year. The Blowfish had more starters score than the Wildcats, but Butler's high scorer managed only 6 points - WR Eric Metcalf.

Who else but the Wisconsin franchise - Emmitt Smith - led the Cheeseheads with 14 points. Four other starters added either 5 or 6 points for Wisconsin. Mercer's lone bright spot was RB Greg Hill, who pitched in 11 points for the Mustangs.
